
Clovis To Coal

Musselshell Valley Historical Museum 11,000-year Community Identity Project




Late Ice Age Clovis hunter

Greetings,

The Musselshell Valley Historical Museum in Roundup, Montana is currently developing an 11,000-year community identity project. The project is being designed and implemented by Dr. Larry Lahren, archaeologist and owner of Anthro Research in Livingston, Montana and his staff.

Themed, from "Clovis to Coal", the project includes several components. Existing archaeological collections have been reviewed by Dr. Lahren and archaeologist Tom Jerde for inclusion in the exhibit. Historian Jerry Brekke is assisting in the creation of interpretive displays that explain the human connection to the Musselshell Valley from the end of the last Ice Age through the homestead settlement era.

The exhibits will also feature a world-class interpretive display of replica stone tools, bow and arrows, and other prehistoric tools by master craftsman Bill McConnell, founder of the Past Skills Wilderness and Tracking School in Bozeman, Montana.

The project is scheduled to be completed for the museum opening in May 2013. A public presentation and demonstration of the use of the atlatl, Ishi bow, and stone tool making and use by Bill McConnell is planned for the May event.


The project has been made possible by contributions from the individual donors, the Musselshell Valley Community Foundation, the local school system, and a private memorial.




